# K-movie and Hallyu

(Summer 2024)

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### **Course Description**:

This course is designed as an introductory survey to the major social, cultural, and popular trends related to globalization, commercialization, and consumption of the latest trends in the "Korean Wave" based domestically and abroad. Class lectures will analyze K-movies and various Hallyu content through case studies and interactive approaches. By taking an inter-disciplinary comparative and historical approach, we will adopt a critical view towards the making and marketing of 'Korean" cultural content and industry, for both domestic audiences and increasingly international consumption.

## **Course Objectives:**

The general course objective is to equip students with the knowledge and concepts needed to comprehensively understand contemporary Korean popular culture and its global reception.

### **Course Format:**

Lecture attendance and participation, as outlined in the following class schedule, constitute the most important part of the course. Lectures will be given by the instructor. In the middle of the lectures, this course will run discussions. Student participation in class discussions will comprise an important part of this course. In-class presentations will consist of a current topic of students' choice related to K-movie and Hallyu.

## Attendance (10%):

- FA System

Sogang University has a policy known as the FA (Failure because of Absences) System, which requires students to be present for a minimum number of classes in order to pass a course. In order to receive credits, students are required to participate in at least 80% of the total class hours. (Three tardies are equivalent to one absence.)

The grade for the course in which a student receives an FA will be recorded as FA. The student who receives an FA will be removed from the class list and will not be able to receive any credit for the course.

- Attendance

Attending lectures is the student's basic right and responsibility. The teaching assistant checks attendance at the beginning of class. A student who comes within 10 minutes of the beginning of class is considered tardy, and after 10 minutes, absent. A student who leaves the classroom during the class session is also counted as absent. Three tardies are counted as one absence.

**Exam (40%: 20% x 2):** Midterm and Final. Exams will cover lectures, class materials and discussions.

<u>Case Study Presentation (20%)</u>: During Week 1, students will decide the topic of their final project which is a case study from one area of K-movie and Hallyu.

- PowerPoint Presentation (20%): 8 12 slides, slides could include photos and video clips.
- Evaluation: Content (10 pts), Delivery (5pts), Leading discussions after a presentation (5pts)
- 15 minutes presentation and 5 minutes discussion

Workshop (10% x 3): Day 8, 12, and 13.

- 1) 1-page essay on field trip
- 2) <Itaewon Class> comparison between the webtoon and the drama
- 3) Analysis 5 K-pop music videos (Any songs and any singers)
