BONG Youngshik Daniel is a research fellow at Yonsei University's Institute for North Korean Studies in Seoul, Korea. Dr. Bong served as the Director of Foreign Policy and National Security Program and Senior Research Fellow at the Asan Institute from 2011 to 2016. He was also an assistant professor at American University's School of International Service in Washington D.C., Freeman Assistant Professor of Korean Studies at Williams College, MA and Post-Doctoral Fellow at Wellesley College, MA.
