Melissa S. Dale is Executive Director and Associate Professor at the Center for Asia Pacific Studies at the University of San Francisco. She received a PhD in East Asian History (China) from Georgetown University, an MA in Asian Languages (Chinese) from Stanford University, and a BA in Oriental Languages (Chinese) from the University of California, Berkeley. Her research interests focus on the social history of late imperial China including Qing dynasty court life, eunuchs, Chinese-Western medical exchange, and gender studies. She has taught courses at Georgetown University, Santa Clara University, and the University of California, Santa Cruz, guest lectured at UC Berkeley, and led the CAL Alumni tour to China. Prof. Dale has served as Executive Director of the Center for Asia Pacific Studies since August 2012.

Before joining the faculty and staff at USF, she served as Associate Director of International Relations at the University of California, Berkeley (Nov. 2011 – Aug. 2012) where she worked in the areas of international relations and development with a particular focus on prospect development and stewardship for leadership and major gifts from the Asia-Pacific region. From Sept. 2008 – Nov. 2011, she was Assistant Director for Strategic Planning at the Institute of East Asian Studies at UC Berkeley. She previously worked at USF as the Associate Director of Research at the Center's Ricci Institute for Chinese-Western Cultural History.
